ITEM I: CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Recommendation:

That the minutes of the Environmental Protection Committee Meeting held on Wednesday, November 2, 1988 be considered read and adopted.

ITEM II: NEWSPAPER RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Committee discussed the canvassing of all households in the City by the Scouts to bolster participation in the newspaper recycling program. D. Murphy presented a brochure for discussion. Two minor changes were suggested by Alderman Gates and agreed to by the Committee. It was suggested that 10,000 brochures be printed and that 4,500 blue bags be ordered for distribution. December 3, 1988 was suggested as an appropriate date for the canvassing project.

A budget of \$4,000 was suggested for the project as follows:

Brochures	\$ 700
Blue Bags	1,000
Contribution to Scouts	2,000
Advertising and Contingency	300
Total	\$4,000

It was noted that \$2,000 of the cost would be covered by GVRD's Recycling Grant previously approved and that the budget was available in the 1988 Environmental Protection Budget.

Recommendation:

That Council be requested to approve the canvassing of households by the Scouts on December 3, 1988 to bolster participation in the Newspaper Recycling Program at a budget cost of \$4,000 including a donation of \$2,000 to the Scouts for their services.
