It was generally agreed that the trail should not exit onto Mary Hill Road, but rather cross the connector road and proceed west along Mary Hill Road.

SUBJECT: Wells for Monitoring Ground Water - Lions Park & Flint Park

Intra West Development Corporation is proposing to develop a shopping centre at the southeast corner of Shaughnessy Street and Lougheed Highway. There is some oil contamination of the site and Thurber Consultants Ltd. is conducting a cleanup program. As part of this cleanup program Thurber would like to construct three monitoring wells at the following locations in order to measure a seepage of hydrocarbon in the ground water:

- Two monitoring wells in Lions Park.
- One monitoring well in McMitchell Park.


The attached Map "A" shows the monitoring well locations. These wells involve the installation of two inch diameter PVC pipe with a locked steel case, which is approximately three feet high and eight inches wide (see attached figures). The wells would be located in unobtrusive location, within the Parks.



SUBJECT:

Revised Admission Rates Due To G.S.T.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the attached revised schedule of Admission Rates be adopted for implementation, should G.S.T. legislation become law.

Purpose/Problem:

The purpose of this report is to provide the Parks and Recreation Committee with information and a recommendation regarding a proposal to revise admission rates to accommodate the Goods and Services Tax.

Discussion:

The Goods and Services Tax is currently being debated in the Senate. Should this legislation become law, it will have a dramatic effect on most Parks and Recreation services. All services provided by the Recreation Division will be taxable with the exception of most programs delivered directly by the Division, for children under the age of 14 years.

In the case of registered programs, facility rentals and concession sales, the Goods and Services Tax will be added on at the point of purchase and will be accounted for on the sales receipt. However, in the case of admission rates, we feel it is easier to role the G.S.T. into the rate and round it up or down to the nearest nickel. This way, our Cashiers will not have to deal with a lot of pennies and there will not be any confusion with regards to what the admission rates are.

The admission rates for skating and swimming, etc are approved by City Council each year as part of the annual schedule of fees and charges. Therefore, these revised rates need to be ratified by City Council. Please note that these revised rates only deal with the G.S.T. and not inflationary increases. Market and inflation increases will be dealt with under separate cover in the New Year, when a revised fees and charges policy is presented for Council's consideration.

Summary:

The G.S.T. is currently being debated in the Senate. Should this legislation become law, it will have a dramatic effect on the services provided by the Parks and Recreation Department. Revised admission rates (for swimming and skating) that include the G.S.T. period need to be adopted by City Council as part of our approved schedule of fees and charges.


Summary:

Rosette — 100% nylon, 6' x 3'.


