Furthermore, the time being utilized is ringette and figure skating time and normally we would be getting the full ice rental rate paid; by entertaining a 50% reduction we would lose.

Recommendation:


That the Minor Hockey Association be permitted to use the vacant lot on December 6th, 1986. Furthermore, that they be informed to enter the lot from the rear entrance.







DATES: JANUARY 2nd , 3rd , AND 4th , 1987



SOME RULES AND GUIDELINES: (Please read carefully)

- 1) This is strictly a Novice House Jamboree. "ALL STAR" teams or "REP TEAMS" are NOT permitted to participate.
- 2) All games will be played under BCAHA and PCAHA rules and regulations governing Jamboree play.
- 3) All games will be Fifty (50) minutes long with a five minute warm up. Two (2) fifteen (15) minute and one (1) twenty (20) minute running time periods.
- 4) NO DOUBLE SHIFTING of players is allowed. All players are to have equal playing time.
- 5) Teams will consist of a MINIMUM of twelve (12) players.
- 6) Players from a Lower Division may be brought up to fill a roster. PLAYERS CANNOT be brought down from Higher Divisions or taken from other teams in their division.
- 7) In case of sweater conflict, the HOME Team will change. PLEASE SEND SWEATER COLORS.
- 8) There will be NO overtime and points will be allocated as follows for games:
 - WIN - 2 POINTS
 - TIE - 1 POINT
 - LOSS - 0 POINTS
- 9) All teams will play a minimum of four (4) games.
- 10) In case of a Tie for First Place in a Division - Goals against count.
In case of a further Tie - Goals for count.
In case of Deadlock - Least penalty minutes.
- 11) Penalties will be Three (3) minutes running time.



Re: Fee Waiver, Hyde Creek


Each year the Coquitlam Area Fine Arts Council sponsors a Festival of the Arts, the major C.A.F.A.C. event for the District #43 performing artists. This year, we have tentatively booked Hyde Creek Recreation Center on April 24, 25 and 26 (1987) for this purpose.

As you know, we receive no other financial support for the Arts Council from the municipality for the cultural and arts programs we sponsor, except through the gracious waivering of facility use fees. Moreover, in past years, the three communities - Port Moody, Coquitlam, and Port Coquitlam - have shared the responsibility for fee waiver and the provision of facilities on a rotating basis. The Festival of the Arts for 1987 is "due" to be held in Port Coquitlam. Therefore, as you have in the past, we ask you to waive the normal fee for the use of Hyde Creek Recreation Center for the Festival of the Arts.

The Festival this year is planned around the theme: "Sports in the Arts." All musical and dance performances will incorporate this theme, and all artistic representations will reflect it. Prominent local athletes are being invited for the promotion of the Festival. SUBJECT: Boat Launching Ramp for Mary Hill Industrial Area



Bill Brown passed on to me a letter from Bob Muster of Wolstencroft Realty Corporation requesting information on the City's plans for a boat launch at the Fraser River end of Coast Meridian Road.

At the present time what actually exists at Coast Meridian Road can best be described as a crude barge landing. It has been used by a number of our large industries to load oversized manufactured goods directly onto barges. The reason I refer to this as a crude barge landing is because it is not usable unless the river is quite high. To make it suitable for a year round barge landing it would be necessary either to build a proper head wall and excavate the river bed right to the head wall or to extend a structure out into the river. I think that having a facility like this would be beneficial to the development of our Industrial Area but would obviously be expensive and require extensive approvals from the parties involved in the Fraser River Estuary Management Plan.

There is no boat launch ramp as such at this location and the construction of a boat launch ramp would interfere with the use of the barge landing. With proper design, it is possible that both a boat launch ramp and barge landing can be combined in one facility at one location. Aside from the potential industrial use of a boat launch ramp, there would appear to be some demand for a public boat launch ramp in the City for recreational purposes. It would not necessarily have to be at this location. Another alternative location could be the bottom of Pitt River Road although this is presently occupied by the property owners of both sides.

Whether the City should be considering a proper barge landing and boat launch ramp might well be a question to be considered by the Industrial Development Committee and perhaps the Parks and Recreation Committee for a public boat launch ramp.
