Also in attendance were K. Janna Taylor, Parks & Recreation Director and Ken Webber (Item No. 1).

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

That the minutes of the meeting of the Parks & Recreation Committee held on Wednesday, March 26th, 1986, be taken as read and adopted.

Item No. 1 Hyde Creek Feasibility Study

Ken Weber went over various aspects of the proposed expansion at Hyde Creek Centre. Areas and concerns discussed were racquetball/squash courts, whirlpool, tot pool, sauna, aerobic area, gymnastic area, elevator, roof, judo and many more. Ken noted that the Committee's concerns and indicated that he would come back and meet with the Committee again on April 14th at 3:45 p.m. It was also recommended that the final public information meeting be held in May; exact date to be determined shortly.

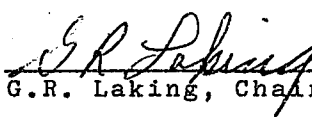

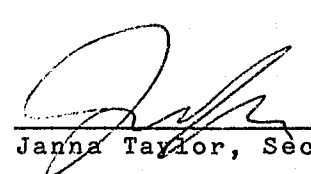

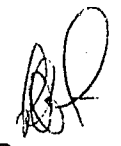

I would like to bring it to your and the committees attention that during the last weekends in particular we had extensif vandalism on the landscaping around the library and if this trend keeps up we might have to replace quite a few large cherry trees and broken of shrubs ,which will amount to : large sum of money. They also set fire to a container, which was located under the roof overhang , which could have had led to a fire. Sprinkler heads have been broken off , windows broken.

All this is probably caused by lack of sufficient light. There are lights installed in the landscape plan but they have never worked , inequate to eliviate the problem or are just vandalised because they are low placed. This area is a favourate spots for kids at night ; close to the 7 /11 store and the video arcade just kiddy corner. If we dont get more police surveillance this attractif building and landscaping could become a shame and eyesore to the taxpayer. Councils decision about installing proper lights should be investigated again. Liquer bottles are found. La cross box is damaged heavily also.

 - 4 people circulating

ENTRANCE PROCEDURE

- check coats
- check purses
- check clothing
- check I.D. (ask for school cards)
- no readmissions
- no intoxicated people allowed in

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ENTRANCE PROCEDURE cont'd

- intoxicated individuals are to be turned over to the police and confiscated liquor poured out at the door

CLEAN-UP

- garbage bags and brooms available
- chairs stacked
- floors swept
- ashtrays picked up

CONCESSION

- can pop (no glass bottles)
- confectionary

SUBJECT: School District #43 Participation

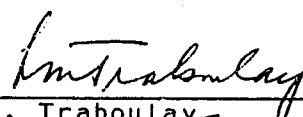
RECOMMENDATION:
