8. Torchlight Tattoo Formations—

The Massed Buglers will sound "First Post", and the Arena will be darkened, with the exception of a single light on the Union Jack on the Flagstaff. The Torch bearers will enter the Arena, and after forming in Column, will go through various evolutions which will include the Circle, the Maze, the Cross, the Wheel, the Double Maze, etc., ending in "V" formation facing the Grandstand.

9. The Grand Finale—

- (a) The Trumpeter will sound "Assembly", and all torches will be extinguished.
- (b) The Arena is lighted up, showing the assembled Troops in "V" formation, with the Massed Bands and the Colour Party in the centre, flanked on either side by the Officers with drawn swords.
- (c) Massed Buglers sound "Last Post" and the Arena is again darkened.
- (d) The Massed Bands play one verse of "Abide With Me", during which an illuminated Cross will appear in the background. (The audience is specially invited to join in the singing of the hymn).
- (e) Kipling's "Recessional" will be recited by the Rev. George Biddle, Chaplain of the 1st Veterans Battalion.
- (f) Massed Buglers will sound "Reveille", and the Arena will be illuminated. The parade will present arms, and Colours will be lowered in a "Royal Salute," while the Band plays
