Zeballos, 16th October, 1938

Visited the Miner's Rest and the Riverside Clubs but business quiet. Three drunks in McKinley's place and half a dozen men and women in the rear of the Riverside Club drinking very little noise as the few people in the town are working.

The miners who came in for Saturday night have mostly gone back to work during the night and this morning. This is boat day so decided to return as there is not another boat out until the 26th inst. and I don't think we can get much further information here. What we have is easily checked and would advise that someone with authority would visit the Bawdy house keeper, Mrs. Alphonse Mony and Mr. Tom Dawson, also Mr. McDoneld. Mrs. Mony's documents can be seen and if she is scared into it she will spill everything and I am sure that Mr. Dawson will turn over the \$1500.00 cheque or allow you to photograph it.
